1	Pending, case screening (also, "case review completed" when used as a closure code)	Classified by patrol as "pending" status & first 6 screening factors marked "no" on Page 2 of Incident Report. Pending reports MAY be assigned to a detective for case review purposes only - not to actively investigate the case . After completing review, detective should clear with code "1" or shall make active if additional information is made known that would qualify as "Active" per case screening requirements #1-6. Cases may NOT be arbitrarily changed from "Active" to "Pending" status, then cleared with a "1". A case with <i>any</i> of the first 5 screening factors appropriately marked "yes" shall be closed with a 100-200 clearance code, not a "1". REFER TO CODE 121 if patrol classified "Active" only due to "Writer/Reviewer Discretion" and DB disagrees.	N/A			
110	Reassigned to Detective Division	Cases initially assigned to Det. Division should not require DB to clear with this code. This code is intended for those cases initially sent to DB, then reassigned to L.A.S.D. Detective Division to handle.	99	•

121	Inactive, Case Screening	Patrol classified as "Active" by "Writer/Reviewer Discretion" only and DB (supervisor) disagrees with patrol reasoning to make case "Active." Essentially, an override of the patrol supervisor.	None	•

214	Victim refuses to cooperate	Victim is uncooperative with investigator(s) and/or unwilling to testify against the suspect(s). DB supervisors should closely scrutinize these closures to ensure proper diligence and thoroughness of department investigation. Whenever possible, investigator should ensure victim(s) have signed refusal to prosecute form, which is retained in the case file and considered by reviewing supervisor when approving closure. Where appropriate, matter may still be referred to DA in cases where department interests would benefit from such review and concurrence (rejection).	61, 70		•	•
