## 5-02/160.15 - Protective Custody

Section 279.6 PC provides: "A law enforcement officer may take a child into protective custody under any of the following circumstances:

- It reasonably appears to the officer that a person is likely to conceal the child, flee the jurisdiction with the child, or, by flight or concealment, evade the authority of the court;
- There is no lawful custodian available to take custody of the child;
- There are conflicting custody orders or conflicting claims to custody and the parties cannot agree which party should take custody of the child; and/or
- The child is an abducted child.

**NOTE:** Children taken into temporary custody under this section will <u>not</u> be released by the Field Deputy under any circumstances. The children will be released to the Department of Children and Family Services.
