

4-01/000.00 Crime Reporting Procedures

All custody personnel are expected to complete crime reports during their shift, except as indicated below. Unit commanders shall ensure that all required reports are completed in accordance with this policy and distributed pursuant to the Department's Manual of Policy and Procedures (MPP), Volume 4, "Case Assignment and Reporting."

All units initiating a first report where a Uniform Report Number (URN) is issued, are responsible for making the necessary entries into the Los Angeles Regional Crime Information System (LARCIS), per MPP section [4-01/140.00](#), "Los Angeles Regional Crime Information System (LARCIS)." Entries into LARCIS shall be made within three (3) business days and shall include information contained in the Custody Services Division Crime Analysis Supplemental Form ([SH-R-49C](#)).

Custody Investigative Services (CIS) shall be contacted for major incidents such as riots or assaults where there are significant injuries. CIS may be contacted at any time of the day, including weekends and holidays.

When there is evidence that a crime involving an inmate may have been committed in a custody facility, the appropriate report(s) shall be prepared and assigned to the designated investigating unit as specified in MPP section [4-19/050.00](#), "Prisoners."

DEFERRED REPORTS

Completion of a crime report may be deferred, if it cannot otherwise reasonably be completed during the handling employee's shift, for the following types of incidents:

- Those wherein there is no workable information, including felonies;
- Misdemeanors;
- Any other report that the watch sergeant or watch commander approves to be deferred.

All report deferrals shall be approved by the watch sergeant, utilizing the above criteria (refer to CDM [4-01/000.50](#), "Deferred Report Procedures," for additional criteria and documentation guidelines). Deputy personnel shall complete all deferred reports by the end of their shift on the next calendar day. If the deputy is not scheduled to work the next calendar day, reconsideration for deferral by the watch sergeant may be necessary (refer to MPP [3-02/290.10](#), "Specific Guidelines," for additional information pertaining to deferred reports and authorization of overtime). Watch sergeants shall be responsible for maintaining a Deferred Report Log and reviewing it for overdue reports on a daily basis.

NOTIFICATION OF SEXUAL ABUSE OR SEXUAL HARASSMENT INVOLVING AN INMATE

In accordance with the Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA) of 2003, custody personnel shall adhere to the following:

- Immediately report any knowledge, suspicion, or information regarding an incident of sexual abuse or sexual harassment involving an inmate, whether made verbally or in writing, including third-party and anonymous reports (regardless of whether the alleged incident occurred at another facility or agency) to a supervisor with the minimum rank of sergeant and complete an Incident Report (SH-R-49) as needed.
- The supervisor with the minimum rank of sergeant shall notify CIS and the watch commander of any

allegations of sexually related crimes and complete a PREA allegation alert by the end of their shift (refer to CDM section 3-04/025.10, "PREA – First Responder Duties and Coordinated Response Protocol," for additional documentation and procedural guidelines).

- Immediately report any knowledge of retaliation against inmates or staff who have reported an incident of sexual abuse or sexual harassment involving an inmate, in accordance with CDM section 3-04/025.55, "PREA – Protection Against Retaliation."
- Ensure all inmate victims of sexual abuse are provided with support services, in accordance with CDM section 3-04/025.20, "PREA – Support Services for Inmate Victims of Sexual Abuse."

Department members shall not reveal any information related to a sexual abuse or sexual harassment report to anyone other than to the extent necessary to obtain treatment or aid in the investigation. If Department members would like to privately report an incident of sexual abuse or sexual harassment of an inmate, they shall report it to the on-duty watch commander.

If the alleged inmate victim is a child, dependent adult, or an elder adult, the Department shall report the incident to the appropriate mandatory reporting agency. Refer to Field Operations Directive (FOD) [02-002](#), "Tracking Family Abuse Crimes," and [03-004](#), "Child Abuse and Neglect Reporting Act."

REPORTING/HANDLING OF HATE CRIMES

Custody personnel handling a hate crime or hate incident shall notify a line supervisor with the minimum rank of sergeant, prepare an Incident Report (SH-R-49), and ensure a completed [Hate Crime Handling Checklist](#) is attached to the original Incident Report (SH-R-49). The notified line supervisor shall ensure an e-mail notification is sent to the respective unit commander, the designated Custody Division Hate Crime Coordinator and the Department Hate Crime Task Force. The email notification shall include the URN, date, time, and location of the hate crime or hate incident, along with a brief synopsis of the event.

All completed hate crime and hate incident reports shall be assigned to and investigated by the Jail Investigations Unit (JIU). JIU detectives shall review reports for proper classification and determine if the incident should, or should not, be listed as a hate crime. For any case involving a hate crime or hate incident, the assigned JIU detective may consult with a member of the Hate Crimes Task Force to determine which unit will assume investigative responsibility. Based on that consultation, Department Hate Crime Coordinator will decide whether the case will be handled by the Hate Crimes Task Force or remain with JIU. If the case is assumed by the Hate Crimes Task Force, the JIU investigator shall complete the case-clearance supplemental report using clearance code "110 – Reassigned to Detective Division."

All noteworthy hate crimes or hate incidents (e.g. riot, major inmate disturbance, etc.) shall be immediately reported via telephone to the on-call Hate Crimes Task Force investigator. If after hours, the Sheriff's Information Bureau (SIB) may be contacted to make such notification.

Custody Division shall have at least one designated Hate Crimes Coordinator from JIU.

The Custody Division Hate Crimes Coordinator shall:

- Review reports to ensure all appropriate reports have been completed and all required information has been included
- Serve as liaison to the handling investigator, the Department Hate Crimes Coordinator, and any relevant

community-based organizations

- Act as an information resource for deputies at their unit regarding hate crimes and hate incidents
- Ensure all approved hate crime reports are emailed to the "Hate Crime Task Force" distribution group in Outlook

This policy incorporates by reference the Manual of Policy and Procedures (MPP) sections 4-11/012.00, "Hate Crimes," 5-09/510.04 "Handling of Hate Crimes and Hate Incidents – Initial Response," and 5-09/510.05, "Handling Hate Crimes and Hate Incidents – Supervision."

RECEIVING INFORMATION RELATING TO EXISTING CRIMINAL CASES AND/OR POTENTIAL CRIMES

Custody personnel receiving information from an inmate relating to a potential crime or active criminal case, regardless of the jurisdiction, shall immediately report all information to their respective sergeant. The sergeant shall conduct an inquiry to ascertain the jurisdiction and whether a criminal report was written. The sergeant shall ensure the appropriate detective unit and/or agency is notified immediately.

Personnel should refrain from conducting an investigative interview of the suspect/inmate in the absence of the investigative unit having jurisdiction, unless the urgency of the information received dictates it. In all instances, there shall be a written memorandum (SH-AD-32A) reporting the information to the appropriate investigative unit or agency, including as follow-up to a personal contact with that unit or agency.

In situations where the reporting inmate has safety concerns, CIS – Jail Liaison Unit shall be notified. They will evaluate whether the reporting inmate meets the criteria for protective custody.

Information of an emergent nature that affects jail security and/or the safety of the inmate shall be reported to an on-duty watch commander immediately, handled according to Custody Division Manual (CDM) section [5-01/030.00](#), "Inmate Classification and Identification," and forwarded to CIS - Jail Liaison Unit as soon as possible.
